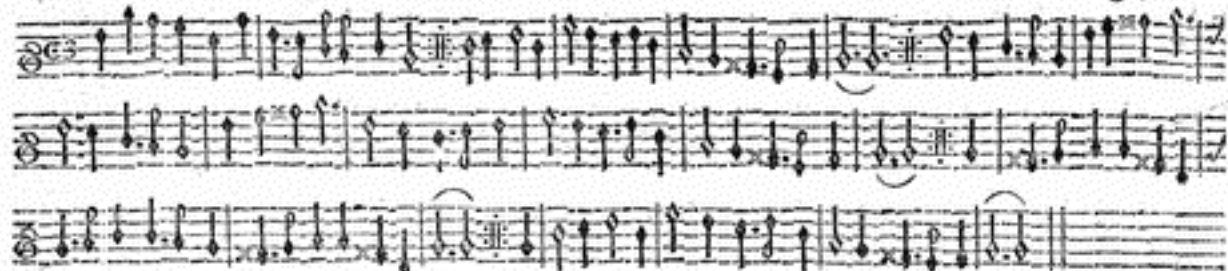

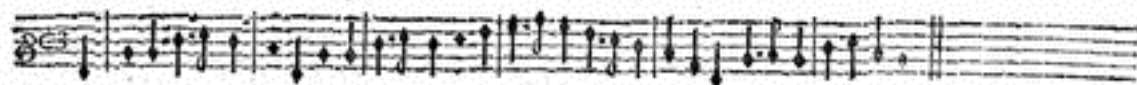

Take all hands and go round, back again. All the men go in and meet in the middle and back again, then the wo. do as much, then the first cu. lead into the middle and back again, then give your right hand to your wo. and turn her round, so the next cu. do the same, and so to the last, the *Musick* playing the same Strain till they have led in. Then every man gives his right hand to his own wo. and turns her once and a half, and then goes on to the next, and so till he comes to his own. So do all again, but leave out the first Strain till every couple has begun to lead in.

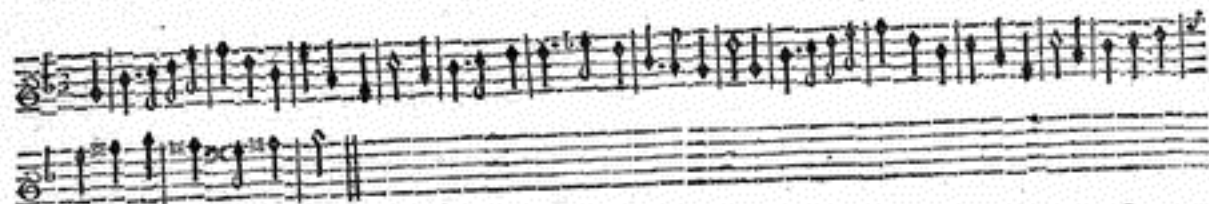

Joan Sanderfon, or The Cushion Dance.

An old Round Dance.



This Dance is began by a single Person, (either Man or Woman,) who taking a Cushion in his hand dances about the Room, and at the end of the Tune he stops, and sings, *This Dance it will no farther go.* The Musician answers, *I pray you, good Sir, why say you so?* Man. *Because Joan Sanderfon will not come to.* Musick. *She must come to, and she shall come to, and she must come whether she will or no.* Then he lays down the Cushion before a woman, on which she kneels, and he kisses her, singing, *Welcome Joan Sanderfon, welcome, welcome.* Then she rises, takes up the Cushion, and both dance, singing, *Prinkum-prankum is a fine Dance, and shall we go dance it once again, once again, and once again, and shall we go dance it once again?* Then making a stop, the wo. sings, as before, *This Dance, &c.* Musick. *I pray you, Madam, &c.* Woman. *Because John Sanderfon, &c.* Musick. *He must, &c.* And so she lays down the Cushion before a man, who kneeling upon it, salutes her, she singing, *Welcome John Sanderfon, &c.* Then he taking up the Cushion, they take hands and dance round, singing as before; and thus they do till the whole company are taken into the Ring. Then the Cushion is laid before the first man, the wo. singing, *This Dance, &c.* (as before,) only in stead of — *come to*, they sing — *go fro*; and instead of *Welcome John Sanderfon, &c.* they sing, *Farewel John Sanderfon, farewell, farewell*; and so they go out one by one as they came in. *Note*, The woman is kiss'd by all the men in the Ring at her coming in and going out, and likewise the man by the women.

Kemp's Jigg.

Round for Six.



One man lead in two we. forwards and back _ : Honour to one, honour to the other, then turn the third _ :
 Lead your own with your left hand, and the woman you turned, and as much _ : Then as much with the
 other two we. turning your own _ : The next man as much _ : : Then the third as much _ : :

First man lead the we. as before ; turn half round holding both hands, and his own as much to the

A Figure Dance for eight, thus :

First and 3. cu. meet, and taking the co. wo. fall back into the 2. and 4. place, whilst the 2. and 4. fall back each from his own, and meet the co. wo. in the 1. and 3. place. As much again.

First and 3. cu. meet and turn S. Men cross over, then we. cross over. The other four doing as much. Then all this back again to your places.

This as before.

First and 3. cu. meet, turning back to back, and hands inward and go half round. The other four as much. All this again to your places.

This as before.

Meet and honour to your own, right hand to the co. and left to your own. The other four as much. All this again, honouring to the co. wo.



Dull Sir John.

A Figure Dance for eight, thus:

The first cu. lead in and cast off to your places, the man going between the 2. cu. and the wo. between the 4. and the 3. cu. as much. The 2. as much, and the 4. as much.

The 1. and 3. man change places across, their wo. as much, hands all four either round or across, and go round to your places. The 2. and 4. cu. as much. And fall the last four the men behind the wo.

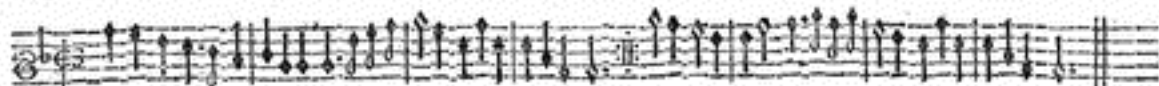
The 4. and 2. man standing behind their wo. the first cu. pass into the 3. place, the man going between the 2. cu. and the woman between the 4. whilst the 3. cu. lead right over and fall into the first place, this back again to your places, the first cu. doing as the third did, and the third as the first, the fourth as much.

Then the 1. and 3. cu. the 2. they twice to your places, the wo. who stand before their men leading it. The other four as much.

Men cast off, and going on the outside your own wo. fall into each other's place, wo. as much, men as much again, wo. as much.

First and 3. cu. meet, go about each other, wo. back to back, not turning your faces, give right hands to the 2. wo. and left hands to your own, and so stay in your own places as at first, the other four doing the like.

Step stately.

A long Dance for 3, 5, 7, or 9 Couple.

Lead up all a D. change places each with his own, keeping your faces still to the Presence, the men slipping behind the we. and the we. before the men, face all to the wall. Men hands, and the we. hands, 1. man and 2. wo. lead all the rest round to the bottom, facing all to the Presence.

The first man and wo. being in the middle, lead up all abreast a D. and back. We. slip before the men to the right, and men behind the we. to the left, going a compass to their places as at first.

The first cu. lead up a D. change hands, and lead down a D. Take hands with the 2. cu. and all four half round, 1. man and 2. wo. change places.

The 2. we. lead up between the 2. men, then crossing over, the 1. wo. go behind the 2. man, and the 2. behind the 1. Men change over by the right hands, then giving left hands to their own we. turn the 1. cu. into the 2. place, and the 2. into the 1.

First cu. cross over, meet in the 2. place, change places. The three uppermost men and the three we. hands, fall a D. back, 2. and 3. cu. change each with his own while the 1. cu. meet, then fall a D. back again three and three.

Now standing as in *Greenwood*, the 1. man between the 2. and 3. wo. and the 1. wo. between the 2. and 3. man, the 1. cu. lead up, cast off and meet below, whilst the 2. and 3. we. and the 2. and 3. men change places. The 1. cu. being in the 3. place, arms, whilst the other four take hands and go half round to the left.

Confess, or The Court Lady.

Longways for six.

Men all a D. Back again.
That again.

Men go between the we. on your left hand, leading them from the other, change hands, meet again, turn them you meeter. Lead your own wo. from each other, meeter again, turn them as you meeter.

Go all cros the Room to the
left hand. Back again.

One man go forwards alone, take one wo. with one hand, then the other, hands all four and go round. The other as much.

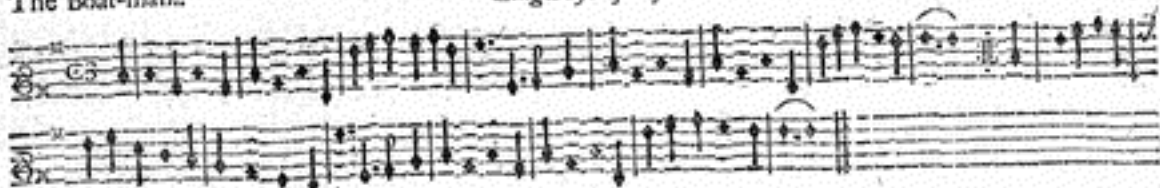

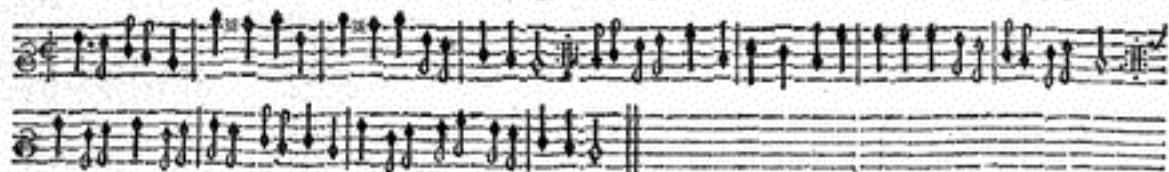

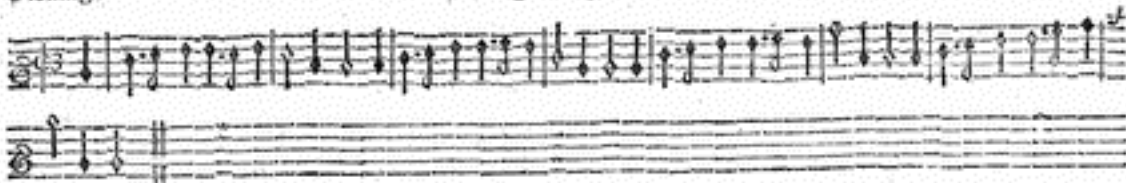

Lead up all a D. forwards and back. That again. First man change places with the 2. wo. then with the last man. Lead up as before, then the wo. change as the man did, every cu. doing thus.

Sides all. That again. First cu. slip down between the 2. they slipping up, then the 2. slip down and the 1. up. All this again, the last cu. crossing over below, go up and cross above, fall to your places. Then the four last slip, and the first cu. cross about.

Arms all. That again. The we. standing still, men going the Hey between them, the last man going about the middle wo. Do thus three times over, then go quite round all the we. to your places. We. as much.

Scotch Cap, or Edinburgh Castle.

Longways for six.

Lead up, back again. — The two upper we. fall back, and the two lowermost men fall back, cross over, then the first man and the lower wo. cross over, then the two upper men fall back, and the two lower we. cross over, then the other cross over as before, these three times over. —

Sides. — That again. — Three men and three we. joining hands, fall all back and meet all, men turn your faces one towards another, we. doing the like, the two ends on each side arms, while the middle with his own, then fall back, then turn your backs together, and every one turn his own. —

Arms. — That again. — Three men slip up, and three we. slip down, then the lower man gives his right hand to the 1. wo. and so go into your places by hands, then the we. slip up and the men slip down, and the first and last give hands to your places as before. —

Shepherd's Holiday, or Labour in vain.

Longways for six.



Lead up all a D. back,
cross over. Lead down,
back again, cross over.

The first man slip before the 2. man while his 1. wo. before the 2. wo. then
the last man slip behind the 2. man while his wo. behind the 2. wo. then
all six turn round about to the left hand into their places, then the last cu.
