COTILLIONS.

#### 1.—Ca Ira.

BALANCE all eight, then half round, the same back again, Ist and 2d couple (opposite) take your partner with both hands, chasse with her to your side with five sleps, back again to your places, bhance with the opposite couple, then cross hands half round, back again with sour hands round, a gentleman with the lady opposite balance in the middle, and set, the other gentleman with the opposite lady do the same, right and lest quite round until to your places. The 3d and 4th couples do the same figures.

II.—The Coquet.
All round, first couple set to the lest

couple, then the other couples, chasse all 4, back again, face to the last couple, and right and left quite round, face to your partner, chasse only five steps, back again, turn your pariner to her former place: The second couple to the lest perform the fame figures, and to the third and fourth couples.

III.—The Convention.

May be danced with the tune of York Fuliliers.

All round, first and opposite couples, balance in the middle, fet, and turn contrary partners, and retreat to your places, the other two couple do the same, chasse all eight and turn the lady to your right quite round, chasse back to your places and turn the lady to your left, then form two lines long way four each fide balance. cross hands four, each corner balance again, and cross hands back, and come to your former places.

IV.—La Fayette Forever.

All round, chasse four open, back again, balance in the middle, then half right and left, the gentlemen balance and turn the ladies to their left hand only half way, set, chasse all eight that you may be in your former places: The 3d and 4 h couples do the same.

V.—German Spa.

All round, the two appoints couple take your parmer's hands, and change places; chasse four only five steps, so back again. balance in the middle, set, half cross hands that you may be in your places, the fame couple turn contrary partners opposite, then turn your own with your right hand half way, balance with your pariner, set, half right and left with the opposite couples, which brings you to your tormer places; the other two couple do the lame.

VI.—Miss Chandler's Colillion.

All round, right and lest all eight half round until you meet your partners, then allemand with your partner until to your tormer places, chasse all eight, turn the lady to your right quite round, chasse back again and turn the lady to your lest, then balance with your parteer and turn her quite round.

# VII — Commercement.

Prominade round 40 steps, sall into two lines, set, sour hands half way round, balance and back, hall right and left with balance.

# VIII.—Duke of Fork's Cotilion.

Top and opposite couple Allemand and allemble, challs to the ladies piace, side coupie the tame, take hands behind and balance, & prominade to your place.

# 1X-The gir! I left behind me.

The gentlemen challe to opposite places, then thort allemande and assemble in the middle and turn the oppolite lady, gentlemen challe to piaces, all balance & half round; side couple ditto; all baiance and back to places.

# COUNTRY DANCES.



1 .- The New Pompe Room.

AST off two couple, up again, four hands half round at top, back again, lead down the middle, up again and cast off one couple, right and left at top.

## 11.—The Young It idow.

Four hands acress half round at top, back again, lead down the middle, and turn your partner half way, then up again, and cast off one couple, the first gentleman stand between the second and third ladies, so his partner between the fecond and third gentleman, balance all fix, then all half way round, first couple stand still, when the 2d and 3d couples balance in the middle, and half right and lest, so every one come to their former places.

# No. III - Allemand Swifs.

Cross four hands at top, half round, back again, cast off one couple, set, balance six, and set, then sour hands round

at the bottom, back again, right and leit at top.

IV. \_It hite Cockade.

Cail eff two coupie, up again, lead down the middie, up again, calt off one course, cross hands at bottom, half round, back again, right and left at top.

V.—Fijver's Harnpipe.

Cast cff two couple, up again, lead down the middle, up again, and call off one couple, cross hands at the bottom, right and left at top.

VI.—Pretty Nancy.

Cross over the first and second couples, balance at the borrom, then turn your pariner, crofs hands at bottom, right and lelt at top.

Crofs four hands, half round, back again, chasse only the first couple, first gentleman fet with second lady, and his parener with the second gendernan, chasse back again, then turn the second couple, that you may be between the second and third couple.

Cast off one couple, change sides, ditto second couple, balance sour abreast, two Pcouple do. first couple, right and lest.

Cast off two couple, turn and lead up he ccuple, three couple balance and turn artners in the center, three couple balince, the lady turn the second gentleman, The gentleman turn the fourth lady, ditto he second lady and first gentleman, and urn to your places

Three couple balance and turn partners, ditto back, down the middle, up 2gain, right and left.

XXXV.—Beliar's Rant.

Change fides, down the middle, up a. gain, four bands half round and back, right and left.

XXXVII. Bulket of Oylers.

A Balance and three hands round with the lady, ditto with the gentleman, down the middle, up again, cast off, right and left.

XXXVIII Miss Moor's rant.

Cast off, up and down the middle, up again and cast off, three gentlemen talance and turn partners, ditto and back.

Three first couple balance, give left & hands and pass out between the full and second gentleman, the fielt and ferond couple coupee and rigadoon, third couple balance, give right hands and pals out bringen me first and second lady, the first and ficond couple coupee to the left, down the middle, up again, call off, right and left.
